

## ICAT AWARDED FUNDING BY HRB

ICAT has been awarded €11 million by the Health Research Board (HRB) for the second phase of the ICAT Programme

This funding will equip clinical academics and clinician scientists across the island of Ireland to address the challenges of an evolving global health agenda in innovative ways.

Through core funding from the HRB and additional funding from the ICAT partners, it is ICAT-2's ambition to train 42 fellows from medicine, surgery, dentistry and veterinary medicine, through five intakes (annually from 2022) and to commit to supporting each fellow throughout their entire career pathway. The ICAT partnership offers infrastructure, experience, and expertise with matched financial support to provide the broadest possible range of research and training opportunities.

"The ICAT programme has created a sea change in how clinical researchers are trained in Ireland, making use of the abundance of high quality research supervisors across our universities. This continued support from the HRB will expand the

programme and support fellows to gain cutting edge research skills both in Ireland and abroad. The medical breakthroughs of the future will be made by these trainees."
